

From the Principal



Dear parents and carers

A special thank you to our Phys ed Specialists- Mr Phil Green and Mrs Maria Heard, who go above and beyond to ensure our students are practising their skills and learning to push their own limits!

Class Placements 2024

In Term 4, I advise parents via the school newsletter that student placements are being considered for the following year. Parents and carers may provide myself as Principal with specific information about their child's learning needs. Such information would not include a request for a particular teacher. The information should be provided in writing (letter or email), directly to myself as the principal and not via a third party or the schools general email address. This information will be referenced, along with other available information, during the class placement process. Requests should be made each year and not assumed previous requests are considered. If this process is not

followed the request will not be considered. *Parents are also advised that these requests are considered but not automatically accommodated.*

Our student leaders



Mrs Essex has done a lot of groundwork to get us here and we are very thankful. She has also been working on school dress requests in our unform and we have decided on a colour and style from a choice of many. We are looking forward to seeing the new dresses and long-sleeved tops being worn by many students in term four.



Use of Therapy Dogs in schools

Our school has been in talks with our School Board regarding alternatives in the busy and often stressful environment of schools and workplaces. At KPS it makes sense that we need to find new ways to provide students and staff with an opportunity to calm and reset throughout the day. Staff and our health and wellbeing officer, Mrs Lina Davidson, are working with students and introducing Ollie and Rufus as non-judgemental, approachable, positive supporters, of the physical and

psychological wellbeing of our students who may engage with our furry friends. We have already had some success and are looking at introducing Ollie as a full therapy dog in 2024. The use of Therapy Dogs in schools and workplaces is a new phenomenon and there is a growing body of evidence recognising a range of benefits resulting from interactions with animals which positively impact the physical and psychological health of those who interact with them. Recent studies have found improvements in cardiovascular health, improved immune system function, improved pain management and a decrease in the experience of stress and anxiety following interactions with a range of animals.

Research in several university settings even found a significant improved in exam results following interactions with a dog in comparison to a group of students who did not engage with the visiting therapy dog. It is purported that the improvement in results was due to the calming and settling effect of the visiting therapy dog which assisted exam participants to manage their anxiety and support concentration. It really is quite amazing how such a small intervention can result in incredible outcomes!

Book Week will take place at KPS between 11-15 September (Week 9). This year's theme is 'Read, grow and inspire'. Author, Kylie Howarth will be running sessions with our students on Tuesday 12th and Thursday 14th September. Book Week Parade is occurring on **September 14th**. 



We are very much looking forward to sharing our Art & Science projects at the upcoming Kardinya PS Open Night in Week 10.


These pictures will give you a hint about what we are learning! All students in Years 3-6 worked with clay to create a symbol of our sustainability goals.

Kulbardi 20 have been learning about rocks and soils. Their "cork people" have taken them to all kinds of landscapes as they explore the natural and human causes of erosion.



CONNECT - our main communications platform



KPS uses CONNECT as our communication platform. CONNECT is a secure online learning, support and communications platform developed by the Department of Education WA for staff, students and parents in public schools.

Teachers use CONNECT to deliver content to the students via an online classroom and to share classroom activities and photos. This means your children will be able to share with you what they are learning about, submit assignments and complete class activities and projects.

Parents can use CONNECT to have easy access to information relevant to your child's classes and learning such as learning activities, teacher feedback and class as well as whole school information.

We use CONNECT to keep you updated with important information. Notices for upcoming events, excursions, reports and newsletters are published via CONNECT.

CONNECT is totally free and because it is provided by the Department of Education, very safe. As well as being able to log into CONNECT on any internet connected device, you may also receive notices sent as either an email or notification on your phone. A free app called CONNECT NOW can be downloaded from Google Play or the Apple App Store and will let you receive CONNECT notices as push notifications. If you require some assistance with CONNECT please see the office for a Step by Step guide.

Working With Children Check for all school visitors





We thank all our parents who generously volunteer their time and energy to support our school community. **There are some changes** to the Working with Children Check policy, to ensure the safety of children when we have volunteers in the school.

If you would like to volunteer at our school, you will need to sign a 'Parent and child volunteer declaration form'. You cannot volunteer if you have a current Working with Children Negative Notice or Interim Negative Notice.

These changes affect parents who are engaged in volunteer work. For example, you are considered a volunteer when you assist with activities such as reading sessions, day excursions, canteen duties, helping at a sports carnival or carrying out P&C duties.

You are not a volunteer when:

- picking up and dropping off your child
- · observing events like school assemblies
- · attending parent and teacher interviews
- visiting the uniform shop.

If your circumstances change, and you are issued with a Negative Notice or Interim Negative Notice after completing the 'Parent and child volunteer declaration form', you must advise the principal.

A current Working with Children Check is required by all other family members and friends over 18 years of age who want to volunteer.

It is a collective responsibility to ensure the safety of our children. We appreciate your ongoing support and dedication to our school community.

All visitors to the school, parent helpers and volunteers as well as students signing in late to school or being signed out early for any reason by parents / carers are required to do so in the Front Office using the IPad.

Regular testing for COVID-19 continues to be an effective strategy to keep our schools and communities safe. It is best to test if you have any flu-like symptoms, such as;

- fever (above 37.5 degrees)
- cough
- shortness of breath
- sore throat
- runny nose
- loss of smell or taste

Parents are asked to use car parks to the west (Ochiltree Way) and north (Sullivan Way) of the school. Please avoid parking in front of the rubbish dumpsters.

For your convenience we have kiss and drive bays on Ochiltree Way facing the school. It is not a parking zone so please do not leave your car in this area. In the interest of safety and traffic flow parents are urged to voluntarily use Ochiltree Way as a one way street before and after school, travelling clockwise around the block if not stopping in the carparking areas.
